
2. GUSTAFSON FINE ARTS CENTER: EXTERIOR WALL

On the side of the building, find the **Mosaic of *The Last Supper*, after Leonardo da Vinci**. Before Christ's death, He had one final meal with His disciples to tell them of the things to come and to tell them once again of the eternal life that He would provide through His death on the cross. This large mosaic of da Vinci's Last Supper is made by using pieces of tile, known as tesserae, to create a picture.

About how many tesserae do you think were used to make this mosaic?



1. ONLINE VIDEO CLIP:

Christ showed great love and compassion to everyone that He encountered. Once while He was traveling, He met a Samaritan woman by a well and began to talk with her as pictured in **Francois de Troy's *Christ and the Samaritan Woman***. This M&G painting is featured in the *Living Gallery* program this year. Answer the questions on the back.



4. RODEHEAVER AUDITORIUM: LOBBY (CASE ON THE RIGHT SIDE, by the coat closet)

The Christ of Derision is a beautiful, but sorrowful sculpture carved in alabaster, a white stone that is easier to carve than marble.

Circle the items from the suffering of Christ that are visible in this sculpture.

- A. The robe and the whip
- B. The vinegar, centurion, and the spear
- C. The crown of thorns

5. Rembrandt's etching of *The Crucifixion* places one thief with his back to the viewer and in shadow, but Christ and the other thief are surrounded by light. Answer the question on the back.

In this painting, what are the two colors Christ is wearing?

In art, **red** often symbolizes love, and **blue** symbolizes truth. Through these colors, the artist communicates that Christ showed love and also spoke truth to this discouraged woman.

This 24-foot-long mosaic version of da Vinci's *Last Supper* was made by the August Wagner Company in Berlin between 1929-1930, and it is approximately 5' smaller than da Vinci's original fresco in Italy.

Right now, M&G's original panel painting is on loan for a large exhibition of 64 paintings from our collection at the Orlando Museum of Art. To see it in person, plan a visit to Florida before May 8, 2022!
