

Georgia O'Keeffe: Mother of American Modernism



What We Learned:

- Georgia O'Keeffe was born in 1887 in Sun Prairie, Wisconsin and died at age 98 in 1986.
- She studied at the Art Institute of Chicago and the Art Students League in New York.
- O'Keeffe was influenced by precisionism and abstract art, but her style was unique.
- She is known for her distinct flowers, dramatic cityscapes, glowing landscapes, and images of bones against a desert sky.

Art Activity: Landscape

O'Keefe's landscapes are abstract and impressionistic. Her paintings capture nature as she saw it. The first picture is Georgia's landscape, Lake George Reflection. To experience the abstract style and explore a new art medium, the students copied her landscape using acrylic paints on canvas.

For Parents:

Georgia O'Keeffe spent the first 15 years of her life on a dairy farm in Wisconsin. She would later move to New York City, spend much of her time in New Mexico, and eventually travel the world. Each of these places would influence her art. She knew she wanted to be an artist at a young age, but in the early 1900s women were expected to only teach art. Georgia did teach art at several different colleges while continuing her own art education. When she was introduced to modern art, she started to develop her own style which was based on her view of the world and her feelings. O'Keeffe is known for her large, magnified flowers, dramatic cityscapes, colorful landscapes, and images of bones with desert backgrounds. Her art became popular during her lifetime, and her works were exhibited at many well-known art museums and galleries. Georgia O'Keeffe is known as the "Mother of American Modernism."
